
In the book, Molly imagines some different ways to help Bea fly. Do you think any of them could work? Why or why not? Design your own structure to help Bea fly:




Create your own pipe cleaner bee!


MATERIALS NEEDED:

- scissors to trim pipe cleaners















Bees need flowers because they provide food (pollen and nectar). Have you noticed which flowers bees like where you live? Do they visit one type of flower more than another?




Do you see any of these flowers where you live?
